Snake bite is declared as a "Neglected tropical Diseases" by WHO. India is capital of snake bites with approximately 45000 death per annum. Snake rescuers had always played a critical role in reducing human-snake conflicts / snake bite by rescuing snakes from human dwellings.

Snake Rescuers are often the first person of contact with public in cases of snake bite. Their valor has a lasting good impression on the public mind. Thus they can be made messengers to spread the awareness among public about Do's and Don'ts in cases snake bite and to blow away various prevailing myths.
