

MESSAGE

Dear Friends,

We had a successful launching of News Letter Vol I, the inaugural volume released by His Excellency Governor of Odisha, on 30th Jan 2013. Now the time for the second one “The Conception”.

As we all know, that the initial hardship, heartburn and scepticism of starting 6 AIIMS was over and taking the MBBS students had become a reality, and no more conjecture. We started our classes on 21st September 2012, with a big challenge, having nothing. However, I may say, nothing happens in a day. Some people are fortunate, and some are not. It is the unfortunate one, who have put hardship and dedicated efforts to match with the one with good fortune. As it is said “Fortune is a lame without Karma. Karma provides the lame fortune to go ahead, in hand with others, with good fortune”.

In this issue of our news letter “The conception”, I must highlight how we have fared in the months, following the initial one. As the classes started, we had a horrendous job, to push ahead with existing facilities, getting inspiration and moral boosting from seniors, well wishers and friends.

Anatomy dissection started from 08th of October 2012. It started with two cadavers, in a small demonstration room in the Physiology Dept. I must tell you all that, we are the first one to get anatomy dissection started amongst 6 AIIMS. We had Physiology Dept. ready, hence, all activities in physiology was initiated in October 2012 and faculty shifted to their office rooms with furniture, provided by Govt. of India. On 07th Nov, we started a small Health Clinic. As we had 50 students and 22 faculty, their health and health of our contractual staff was a priority. We started providing outdoor services to patients walking into our clinic. This was started with the faculty of Community Medicine under the care of Dr Sonu H Subba, who made a roster of the faculty attending the OPD care from 9AM-1PM. Many patients with neurological problems also walked in into our clinic, for which I provided my expert opinion along with Dr Ashis Patnaik. I must thank Mr KN Bhagat, from OTTET, with whom we had a memorandum of understanding to provide equipment, manpower to our clinic,



where we could perform blood sugar, Pulse oxymetry, BMI etc. It may look a small step. However, to may mind drops make an ocean, and nothing is small, when you start from a scratch.

In month of October 2012, we started our biochemistry deptt. practical and physiology practical. However, biochemistry deptt. was taken on possession on 07th Nov 2012, and the faculties occupied their rooms, so also the HOD.


We signed an MOU with Dean and Director of IIT BBSR, to conduct combined research and academic activities, to mutually benefit of two Institutions. With the help of OTTET, we conduct health check up of students and faculties of IIT, once in a week basis, which took us about 6-7 weeks to conduct health check up for 350 persons. We are analysing their health demographics.

On 8th of October, we sent appointment letter to 8 faculties, selected in the specialty of Trauma & Emergency (T&E). Two of our 8 Faculties joined in November. Dr Ashis Patnaik and Dr Swagata Tripathy, Neurosurgeon, Anaesthesiologist respectively. They also provided significant boosting to our out patient services. On 7th Nov 2012, we had First Freshers night. Students and faculties meet at Hotel Suryans. The cultural evening was followed by a grand dinner. Contribution was made by the faculties and students of AIIMS, Bhubaneswar. To my mind the function was mind blowing. To commemorate the occasion, all students and faculties put their signature on a banner as a Souvenir.

On 22nd November 2012, faculty selection was supposed to be held, however, it was rescheduled to 10th Dec 2012.

In Dec 2012 we conducted faculty selection, at Delhi, for non clinical and para clinical subjects, like Pharmacology, Forensic Medicine, Pathology, Microbiology and Nursing etc. It was from 10th to 22nd Dec 2012. In Dec I had inaugurated several conference like (a) Indian Society of Physiology, Odisha branch, Annual Meeting, 9th Dec 2012, (b) 62nd Annual Conference of Anatomical Society of India at KIIT University, on 26th Dec 2012.

Dear friends, space is small and work done in last 3 months in various form was big challenge, which I, as a Director had to undertake. Time will tell in future, my endeavour was worth or not.

Bridging the Gap



Honorable Health Minister, Government of Odisha, Dr.Damodara Rout inaugurated the REGIONAL TELEMEDICINE CENTRE in AIIMS Bhubaneswar on 29th Nov 2012. The centre was established in partnership with Odisha Trust of Technical Education and Training (OTTET) and technical expertise with Sanjay Gandhi Post Graduate Institute of Medical Sciences (SGPGI), Lucknow.

The centre would provide Tele-consultation and Tele-follow-up services along with continual medical education in the Eastern and North-Eastern states. Equipped with facilities for training and teaching different cadres of health professionals, it will also work towards developing manpower in the field of telemedicine and biomedical informatics. The centre will also have a specialized Tele-ophthalmology facility for screening diabetic retinopathy and cataract.

The institute will provide Specialist Tele-consultation services to District Headquarter Hospitals, Sub-divisional Hospitals, community and primary health centres for two hours free of charge every day, AIIMS Director Prof AK Mahapatra said.

Dr Vikas Bhatia, Dean of AIIMS, Bhubaneswar, said the new facility shall be able to correct the health inequality prevailing in the country, as envisaged in mission statement of AIIMS, Bhubaneswar.

Mentorship Programme

AIIMS Bhubaneswar, a new born institute took its first batch of students in September 2012. Fifty students with hopes and dreams entered the campus with exuberance of their youth. With lecture halls not ready, hostel more than 20 KMs away from the college; they braved their way onto the path of becoming doctors.

With this background and the recognition of its importance in framing young minds, a mentoring programme was formulated before the admission process and during admission; all students were allotted mentors by lottery method. At the time only 20 faculty members were there and 50 students. Leaving out the senior most professors to administrative duties, 17 faculty members took under their wings 2 to 3 students each. After the allotment process, the students were given their mentor's name, designation, department, phone number and email address. They were told to contact them and feel free to discuss any issue with them at any time. It was planned to have the students continue with the same mentor from the beginning till they complete their MBBS. New batch of students would get a separate set of faculty members as mentors. This will ensure continuity of mentor-mentee relationship and build mutual trust over the years.

The mentorship programme was envisaged to provide the students with an atmosphere of geniality so that they feel free to express themselves; to provide them with appropriate guidance when needed on personal and academic matters; to identify among them any research interest and provide them with necessary support and guidance. They would also be groomed according to their aptitude into working towards their areas of interest. Many students have been in contact with their mentors regularly and getting help & guidance on various issues, ranging from minor health problems to stress and academic difficulties. With availability of more number of faculty members, more time and space it is hoped that the mentorship programme at AIIMS Bhubaneswar will give ample strength to the students and faculty members alike and be something to emulate from

Why Become Doctor???

“The more we care for the happiness of others, the greater our own sense of well being becomes.” The Medicine of Altruism: Dalai Lama Why did I take up the medical profession? It's one of my life's toughest questions. And I don't completely answer it even now. As a child my dream was to become an astronaut. But later when I grew up to a 15 yr old young impressionable boy, a different sense prevailed. I then asked myself what I needed to achieve in life. And here I introspect what makes us choose this profession which demands perseverance, expense, time & family and why we didn't get lured into any other profession.

I certainly know it's a tough life ahead but anybody else other than a doctor wouldn't know the high of being one. Every so often, maybe not every time as a doctor you get to actually save lives. The happiness and gratitude of the patients and their relatives later on is a very gratifying thing. To alleviate pain and suffering is a doctor's duty but a doctor gets a lot more out of that chore than the patient. He gets a high that no money in this world would suffice to gain it. That's the real reason he or she is there in this profession. If there's any other reason, either that or he or she is in the wrong profession because money is certainly not that incentive though it may certainly come with it.

Obviously, medicine is the noblest profession of all. As a physician you have an opportunity to help others. Wanting to help others and enjoying helping others are necessary attributes of a good physician. This is something that cannot be taught. However, if helping others is important to you, you could be politicians, religious leaders or social workers -all have the opportunity to help others, perhaps in larger numbers. Whereas humane doctors speak language of the body and ought to be the real messengers of God.

Medicine is a career filled with choices. In what other career can you choose between delivering babies, taking care of children, handling emergencies, removing someone's cancer, or talking to someone who needs psychiatric help? Better yet, you can teach others your medical specialty, while still practicing your profession. Alternately, you can do research in whatever specialty you choose, with the potential to make a real breakthrough in preventing or treating illness. In addition, being a physician is honorable and is held in high esteem. It allows you to live just about anywhere, and provides job security (unfortunately, illness is something that will be around for the foreseeable future).

However, all of this comes at a price. The many years of preparation, the discipline, the awesome responsibility, the ethics, and the long hours can take their toll. Medicine is a unique field and it demands a unique person with 4 C's- competence, communication, care & compassion.



Perspectives of the “Last Man” in the Queue

The objective of AIIMS is to provide state of the art health care to the last man in the queue, provide quality medical education as well as excel in research.

Starting with the identity of the last man: it says that we should cater to the last man in the queue- So who is the last man in the queue?

The last man in the queue is the one who literally arrives late not because he was lazy but because he was earning his livelihood and had to put his own health in the backburner. The last man is even a woman, a housewife who has to cook, clean and serve before she can talk about her pain; the last man is that child who lost his parents to AIDS and is now being brought up by an octogenarian grandmother with no income; the last man is that small girl whose brother goes to school and is healthy whereas she is malnourished and has to help her mother in the field. The last man could be a retiree whose meager pension is unable to support the expensive treatment he requires. There is no limit to the definition of the “last man in the queue” and we as service providers must realize that they could come in any form and we should be ready to serve them otherwise the very purpose of our existence can be questioned.

AIIMS intends to provide state of the art health care to the common man- what is 'state of the art' for that man on the street? We say it should be modern, sophisticated and probably expensive centres for highly specialized care and that is no doubt, need of the hour and it is high time. However; for that man on the street, state of the art could be having diseases treated nearer home instead of travelling 3 to 4 thousand KMs to a city unknown, with nowhere to sleep but on sidewalks and taking weeks just to meet the right doctor. It could mean spending minimal amount of money instead of selling the only house or land to cover the cost of treatment.

We intend to have quality medical education for undergraduate and postgraduate students- what does it mean to that last man? It would mean that when he goes to a doctor, he is sure that his diagnosis would be accurate, investigations would be minimal and treatment would be effective. When his daughter studies in one of these institutes, she would be a confident doctor who would not only know how to treat the disease but also explain well, make them feel that she understands and make them feel loved and cared for.

What about excellence in research? What does it mean to the last man? It could probably mean that instead of getting severe side effects or going below poverty line for buying medicines, they get them in affordable rates and suffer minimal side effects. It could mean that instead of living isolated for days in the hospital, they can go home and get the same treatment. It could mean that they will not get a disease as they did not smoke, or when a family member ails from an illness, they are not sure to die as ways to save them have been found.

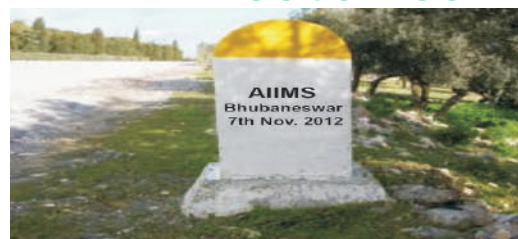
From the Editorial Board...

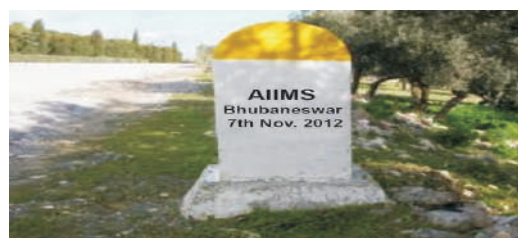
