

From The Director's Desk...

It gives me immense pleasure to pen this message as the founder Director of AIIMS, Bhubaneswar, for the inaugural news letter “Dhauri”. At the outset I thank the Govt of India for selecting me for this post, thereby giving me an opportunity to do something for my state, Odisha, which is otherwise not very advanced, in the field of health care delivery.

To start anything is a very difficult task, when everything is in a state of inertia of rest. After having worked at AIIMS, New Delhi for 37 long years, which is an established Medical Institution of No1 repute in our country, it is very difficult to go and face the odds and start something from scratch. Needless to say it is from palace to slum, from heaven to hell !

Am I capable of this huge responsibility? I did not know. However, during my tenure at AIIMS, New Delhi, and 3 years as Director of SGPGI, Lucknow, UP, I had experienced the charm of sadistic pleasure of playing with fire or work in adverse situation. No doubt there was immense pressure to work hard, which I learnt from my teachers from nursery to AIIMS, but whatever I may have achieved today is all because of their dedication and sincerity. Hence, it will be injustice not to give due regards to my teachers at AIIMS, New Delhi. In fact, a brick to build the tower was initiated by Prof Tandon, Prof AK Banerji, Prof MBL Kapur, Prof Nandy, Prof IK Dhawan and many more. I will forever remain grateful to my teachers. I am grateful to “The all mighty God” to have placed me at AIIMS, New Delhi, and to have given me this life to serve my fellow countrymen.

AIIMS, at Bhubaneswar is a dream for people of Odisha, Govt of Odisha and of course more importantly the dream of Govt of India. AIIMS, “a brand of Medical Science” holds a very high stature, in fact higher than IITs for Engineering or IIM in the field of management. That is because the supremacy AIIMS, New Delhi, enjoyed over the six decades.

“Rome was not built in a day”. Nothing happens in a year or even in a decade. Hence, I have no doubt that even AIIMS, Bhubaneswar will take years to decades to carve its name in the world scenario, with the nature and quality of work, dedication and integrity of the Faculty and students; which are of paramount importance in the making of any institute, be it Harvard, Stanford, John Hopkins or AIIMS. “The Institute is more than just buildings and roads. For dedicated work it is also important to have good infrastructure: buildings, roads, campus and more importantly an environment filled with positive energy, which can make people feel at home, without stress and anxiety. Of course, some positive stress is necessary for the growth and development of anybody. It is like a spoiled child of a rich father. If everything is available in seconds on demand, how do you expect a person to develop?

When I joined, I met eight members of the faculty who themselves had recently joined, the Financial Advisor (FA) Mr.A.K.Jena and the Superintendent Engineer(SE) Mr.C.R.Nanda, who were here for more than 2 years, supervising and running the tremendously huge and difficult construction work.


When I came from the airport, Mr Nanda received me. As I had visited the site many times before joining, I knew the site, the problems and horrible looking work place, without office, accommodation, food, water and electricity. It will be unbelievable to mention that I had to stay in Port guest house for 10 weeks, before shifting to a descent Govt accommodation, at the VIP colony.

On 14th August, Prof Bhatia and I reached Bhubaneswar and celebrated Independence Day on 15th August. It was a great feeling. No money or wealth can replace the happiness that, I had, when I could see the glowing stars in my faculty with happiness of celebration of Independence Day, at AIIMS, Bhubaneswar campus. I was proud to be a citizen of India, a person belonging to Odisha and more importantly the “Founder Director” having 18 hours experience at AIIMS, Bhubaneswar campus.

The work was difficult, there was enthusiasm mixed with anxiety, skepticism and frustration, seeing the bricks, rods, and construction material in all corners of the campus. Without road, electricity and water at times I felt, it is sheer madness to leave AIIMS, New Delhi, and join here to work as a construction worker. I was floating in an Ocean and hardly had anyone to complain. I had on one side my dedicated faculty members 18 by now, and the other side to create some thing out of nothing. The deadline was getting near middle of September, when the undergraduate classes had to start. We all put efforts on a war footing to create few class rooms, got the air-conditioners, projectors, arranged for vehicles and bus for students, arranged for make shift hostel accommodation, got the catering contract finalized, the list runs long It is like a child swimming in an Ocean. Is not it?? “Nothing is impossible” that's “what great Napoleon” had told to this world.

Designing of the Institute Logo, the initiation of the Website may be very small things; however, they were not small for any of us, at AIIMS, Bhubaneswar. It was an Oasis in large desert. We started having food from our vender and could manage a class room to start class and constructed the Director’s and Dean’s offices, near the construction site for easy supervision.

We at AIIMS, Bhubaneswar, were a couple of weeks old now. We started admitting students, the real stars of the AIIMS, Bhubaneswar I could see the smiling faces of our students, mind full with expectations and anxiety. They had no place to stay. A lot of credit goes to our students, for all adverse situations they faced. I spoke to them, gave them hope, expectation and assurance of a great institution. I do not know, I am right or wrong. The time will prove or disprove. I talked to my friends, my well wisher and teachers. On 21st September, 2012, a history was made when we started our meticulously planned orientation programme for the students. Orientation programme was spread over 4 days, with 20 lectures, of 1 hour each. The lectures were delivered by eminent personalities of various walks of life across India. It was a great success. The anxiety of taking students and starting the class was over by 26th September, when I realized that it had really happened. Friends at this moment I am emotional and writing these lines. Believe or not, I did nothing much to take credit. All credit goes to faculty of AIIMS, Bhubaneswar, staff, my well wishers from every corner of India and “God”, who is always with me, in happiness and agony. I thank “Lord Jagannath” for giving me strength and courage for making something from half built houses. That is the reason we thought this issue of “Dhauri”, the news letter must be named as “The Bricks”. I thank MOH & FW, Govt. of India and MOH & FW, Govt. of Odisha for all the helps, moral support and advice given to me in most difficult part of life.

Down the memory lane.....

The foundation stone for this eminent institute was laid by Hon'ble Sri Atal Bihari Vajpayee, the then Prime Minister of India, on 15th July 2003, in village Sijua, on the outskirts of Bhubaneswar. The site was a barren area partially covered with cashew plantation. The development of campus started gradually with beginning of housing construction from Oct 2008. The main construction of Medical college started from May 2010 and Hospital from October 2010. The work was taken up at the site by various agencies amidst various problems, at the ground level. Few of the major hurdles were objections raised by local villagers to closing the internal road, removal of nearly 410 trees from site etc. With the help of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India and the State administration, the problems were sorted out and construction work started. The State Government had provided the land free of cost, developed road around the campus and arranged for water supply at the site.

The building is planned on green building concept with a target to achieve 4 star rating. Some of the green building features are over-deck insulation to minimize heat load, solar light for street lighting, recycling of water and water harvesting. The campus will be provided with 100% Diesel Generator backup. Apart from the 978 bedded hospital attached to the medical college, the campus also hosts the Nursing College, a 1000 seater auditorium and an AYUSH block. Once fully operational, the power requirement in the campus will be about 12 Mega Watts. The mammoth structure made of 87260 cubic meters of concrete, 11221 tonnes of steel and 12640194 bricks has changed the landscape of the place over the last two years. The construction is still in full swing.

The project includes construction of following main buildings.

(a) Hospital Building

The building is mainly RCC framed structure with plinth area of about 111567 sqm. It is designed as spine and rib concept where central facilities like OT, and imaging are placed at spine and various clinical facilities are in the rib. There will be 978 beds in the hospital and 21 OTs. The building will have various OPDs, specialty and super specialty wards. For easy movement of patient and staff there will be 11 no's of 26 passenger, 7 no's of 20 passenger and 6 no's of 16 passenger capacity lifts. The building will be provided with basement parking for staff vehicles.

(a) Medical College Building

The Medical College building is of around 16057 sqm and consists of blocks and dissection hall. All laboratories and lecture rooms are placed in three blocks connected by faculty rooms. There are 4 lifts and 5 staircases in the college.

(b) Nursing College Building

The plinth area of building is 5100 sqm and is G+4 RCC framed structure. The building will be used for teaching of Nursing students.

(c) AYUSH Building- It is a single storied building with 1260 sqm plinth area to be used, dedicated for AYUSH systems of medicine. There will be provision of OPD and 30 beds.

(d) Auditorium- The auditorium building is constructed to accommodate 1000 persons at a time. (300 in balcony and 700 in main hall). The auditorium will have stage with lighting, sound system, under deck insulation etc.

(e) Service complex (2 no's) - The service complex is divided into two parts. One is for Hospital complex and other is for Medical college complex. The main substation, AC plant room (4+1, 725 TR chiller with cooling tower), UG sump (18.5 Lakh Ltr capacity), mortuary, Gas plant room, boiler etc are in service complex-I. Service complex-II accommodates substation for medical college complex, vehicular work shop, mechanical work shop, animal house, STP, ETP and waste disposal facility.

(f) Housing Complex-

The housing complex is coming up adjacent to Hospital building separated by service area. It is an independent complex with its own electricity, water supply facility. In phase-I of construction, 171 quarters, UG, PG and Nursing Hostel are being constructed under the supervision of HSCC.

THE LOGO

The LOGO represents an organization and is placed in all official documents. It was unanimously decided that the logo of AIIMS, Bhubaneswar, an apex health care institute, being stationed at Bhubaneswar and pride of Odisha. It should have elements representing Bhubaneswar and Odisha with a promise of building a healthy and peaceful nation.

The LOGO of AIIMS, Bhubaneswar, has a background of the famous Konark Wheel, an architectural wonder, reflecting the quintessence of Odisha. The Rod of Caduceus with two serpents and a shaft represents the field of medicine and healing process. On the top of it is the “Dhauri Stupa”, also known as Peace pagoda. This Stupa symbolizes “PEACE” and a peaceful life goes hand in hand with a healthy life. The Dhauri Stupa is situated in the outskirts of Bhubaneswar, and hence represents the place where the institute is situated. At the bottom, two famous verses are quoted. The verse “Karmanye Vadhikaraste, Maphalesu Kadachana”, is taken from The Bhagwad Gita which means that a person has control over his efforts and not on the result. The faculty and staff of AIIMS, Bhubaneswar, are dedicated to put their best efforts in building of a healthy nation with the blessings of the Almighty, without expectations. The other verse “Parayakhmam Subami Te” reinforces the Mission of AIIMS, Bhubaneswar, with a prayer to the Supreme Power “Bless and cure all diseases”.



Orientation Programme 21st-25th Sept.2012



The academic session of MBBS course started with an Orientation Programme held at the institute. The orientation programme was scheduled from 21st Sept to 25th September 2012. The four day orientation programme witnessed eminent personalities from different walks of life including medicine. Students had the opportunities to interact with luminaries of medicine, police, law, social scientists and others including the faculty members of the institute.

The orientation programme was inaugurated by the Director Prof. A.K. Mahapatra by lightening the lamp in the presence of the Dean and other faculty members. Lt. Col (Dr.) J.V. Ramamurthi, Chief Executive (Admin.) PMU, MOH & FW, Govt. of India graced the occasion by his presence.

Director Prof. Dr. A.K. Mahapatra addressed the gathering and inspired the students and faculty members regarding his vision of the new AIIMS. He also delivered a lecture on the relationship between Mind, Body and Soul and their integration on today's perspective of life. On the same day, Prof P.N.Tandon, blessed the students and explained that medicine must be practised with love and compassion. Renowned Cardiologist Dr. Kabi Prasad Mishra, stressed the importance of "believing in oneself-working hard- having faith in God" by citing the exemplary example of Dr. Ben Carson.

Day two of the programme was graced by Mr S.K. Patri, Advocate, Supreme Court of India who talked about the interface of Medical Profession & Law. 
